

GURU NANAK NISHKAM SEWAK JATHA (GNNSJ)

GNNSJ is a registered, religious charity dedicated to the selfless service of Sikhs and humanity in general – in the name of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the founder of the Sikh Dharam.

GNNSJ was founded in East Africa during the 1950s by Sant Baba Puran Singh Ji of Kericho, affectionately known as Baba Ji. He was born in 1898 in the Punjab village of Gura. Emigrating to Kenya in 1916, he set up Kericho Wagon Works in 1925 in Kericho, reknowned since Baba Ji settled there and selflessly served the community . Baba Ji's message was not just a philisophy of words – he was a personification of the adage 'practice what you preach' – and in tow of the fundamental teachings of Guru Nanak: Naam Jappo (remember God and live in His Presence); Kirt Karro (earn your living through hard work); and Wand Shakko (whare your good fortune with others). Baba Ji inspired everyone to selflessly carry out the above as a 'labour of love'. In the 1970s, Baba Ji came to England, where many significant, often unprecedented events were made possible through his divine guidance.

On 5 June 1983, Baba Ji left for his heavenly abode, leaving a legacy of exemplary Sikh practice which is the inspiration of all endevaours of GNNSJ. Bhai Sahib Bhai Norang Singh Ji was selected to continue his legacy. Bhai Sahib Ji left for his heavenly abode on 3 July 1995. Bhai Sahib Bhai Mohinder Singh Ji continues on this legacy today.

GNNSJ continues to serve in inter-faith, with a focus towards education of the less fortunate of our society. Nishkam Saint Puran Singh Institute (NSPSI) in Kericho, a humble initiative of GNNSJ, is a prime example of the Jatha's dedication to doing positive good for others, which is a key value of the Sikh Dharam. NSPSI has built bridges between different faith communities across continents, nations and nationalities, supported by respective governments, fostering good will, hope and prosperity at all levels.
